



Safety Instructions


The following illustrations represent the precautions to be taken when using and moving your television.



Do NOT expose the television to extreme temperature conditions or to extreme humidity conditions.




If the television is broken, do not try to repair it yourself. Contact qualified service personnel.




Do NOT expose the television to direct sunlight.



During a storm conditions (especially when there is lightning) unplug the television from the mains socket and aerial.



Do NOT expose the television to any liquids.



If the remote control is not used for a long period of time, remove the batteries and store it in a cool, dry place.

THIS DEVICE IS NOT FOR USE IN INDUSTRIAL ENVIRONMENTS

Displaying any stationary images that exceed the long time, it can cause uneven aging of picture tubes (CRTs) that leave subtle, but permanent burned-in ghost images in the television picture. To avoid this, vary the programming and images, and primarily display full screen moving images, not stationary patterns or dark bars.

Caution

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The lightning flash and arrow head within the triangle is a warning sign alerting you of "dangerous voltage" inside the product.



The exclamation point within the triangle is a warning sign alerting you of important instructions accompanying the product.





The main voltage is indicated on the rear of the TV set and the frequency is 50 or 60Hz.

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

Using the Buttons on the Panel

If the remote control no longer works or you have lost it, you can use controls on the panel of the TV to:


- Switch on the TV when it is in Standby mode and select channels (\triangledown C/P. \bigcirc \blacktriangle)
- Access the main menu (**MENU**)
- Adjust the volume (_ +)

Connection Panels

The actual configuration on your TV may be different, depending on your model.



1 Connecting External A/V Devices (INPUT)

The RCA (VIDEO + AUDIO-L and R) connectors are used for equipment such as camcorders, video disc players and some video game devices.

- When both the side (or front) and rear connectors are connected to external equipment, the side (or front) AV has the priority.
 - When using the mono equipment such as camcorders, video disc players and some video game devices, connect to the "AUDIO-L" input connector.

2 Connecting Headphones

- You can connect a set of headphones to your television if you wish to watch a television programme without disturbing the other people in the room.
- Prolonged use of headphones at a high volume may damage your hearing.


Whenever you connect an audio or video system to your television, ensure that <u>all</u> elements are switched <u>off</u>.

Refer to the documentation supplied with your equipment for detailed connection instructions and associated safety precautions.

The connectors (RCA or SCART) are used for equipment such as video disc players, video game devices, camcorder and VCR.

The RCA (Y + Pb + Pr + AUDIO-L and R) connectors are used for a DVD.

When using the mono equipment such as camcorders, video disc players and some video game devices, connect to the "AUDIO-L" input connector.

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
Viewing Pictures From External Sources

Once you have connected up your various audio and video systems, you can view the different sources by selecting the appropriate input.

1	Check that all the necessary connections have been made.
2	Switch the television on and if necessary, press the VIDEO $(\textcircled{\baselinetarrow})$ button one or more times until the required input is displayed.
	> Depending on the source selected, the pictures may appear automatically.



To watch television programmes again, press the **TV** (□) button and select the number of the channel required.


Operation of remote control may be affected by bright artificial light near to the TV set.

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
Infrared Remote Control (Teletext Functions)

Inserting the Batteries in the Remote Control






You must insert or replace the batteries in the remote control when you :

- Purchase the television.
- Find that the remote control is no longer operating correctly.
- Remove the cover of the remote control by pressing the symbol
 (♥) and pulling the cover in the direction of the arrow.
 - Insert batteries, taking care to respect the polarities:
 - + on the battery with + on the remote control
 - on the battery with on the remote control
- **3** Replace the cover by pushing it in the direction of the arrow.

Connecting the Aerial or Cable Television Network



To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received by the set from one of the following sources:

- An outdoor aerial
- A cable television network
- ♦ A satellite network

Plug the aerial or cable network input cable to the 75Ω coaxial socket on the rear of the television.

Switching Your Television On and Off


The mains lead is attached to the rear of the television.


If you have purchased this television in the United Kingdom, refer to page 38 for further instructions on plug wiring.

- **1** Plug the mains lead into an appropriate socket.
 - The main voltage is indicated on the rear of the TV set and the frequency is 50 or 60Hz.
- Press the "①" (ON/OFF) button on the front of the television.
 <u>Result</u>: The Standby indicator lights up on the front panel.
- **3** Press the **POWER** (()) button on the remote control to switch the television on.

<u>Result</u>: The programme that you were watching last is reselected automatically.

4 To switch your television off, press the "①" (ON/OFF) button again on the front of the television.





Placing Your Television in Standby mode


Your television can be placed in Standby mode, in order to reduce:

- Power consumption
- Wear of the cathode ray tube

The Standby mode can be useful when you wish to interrupt viewing temporarily (during a meal, for example).

The television is placed automatically in Standby mode when you turn it on.

- 1 Press the **POWER** (()) button on the remote control. <u>Result:</u> The screen is turned off and the Standby indicator on the front of the television lights up.
- 2 To switch the screen back on, simply press the **POWER** ((()) button again on the remote control.
 - Do not leave your television in standby mode for long periods of time (when you are away on holiday, for example). In this case, you should switch it off completely.

When the television is initially powered ON, three basic customer settings proceed automatically and subsequently: setting the language, channel and clock.


- 1 If the television is in Standby mode, press the **POWER** ((()) button on the remote control.
 - Result: The message Plug & Play is displayed. It flickers for a little while and then the "Language" menu is automatically displayed.
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select required language. Press the MENU (IIII) button to enter the language, and then the message Ant. Input : Check is displayed.
 - If any language is not selected on the Language menu, the "Language" menu will be displayed about 30 seconds later.
- 3 Make sure that the antenna is connected to the TV. And then press the ◄ or ► button to store the channels (refer to "Storing the Channels Automatically" on page 14).
 - Result: The horizontal bar is displayed, and then channels are stored in an order which reflects their positions in the frequency range.
- 4 When searching and storing is complete, the **Time** menu is displayed.
- 5 Press the ◄ or ► button to move to the hour or minute. Set the hour or minute by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button (refer to "Setting and Displaying the Current Time" on page 31).
- 6 When you have finished, press the **MENU** (IIII) button.
 - <u>Result:</u> The message **ENJOY YOUR WATCHING** is displayed, and then the channel which has been stored will be activated.
- 7 If you want to reset this feature...
 - 1 Press the MENU (IIII) button.
 - 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Function, and then press the ◄ or ► button.
 - 3 Select the Plug & Play by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button, and then press the ◄ or ► button.
 - <u>Result:</u> The message **Plug & Play** is displayed.


Viewing the Demonstration

When you start using your television for the first time, you must select the language which will be used for displaying menus and indications.



Storing the Channels Automatically (depending on the model)

You can scan the frequency ranges available on your television and in your country and store all the channels found automatically.

The channels are stored in the order in which they appear in the frequency bands. It is possible that the automatically allocated numbers may not correspond to those by which you wish to identify the channels. If this is the case, refer to "Sorting the Stored Channels" on page 20.

Storing the Channels Manually (depending on the model)

When storing channels manually, you can choose:

- Whether or not to store each of the channels found.
- The number by which you wish to identify each stored channel.
- **1** Press the **MENU** (IIII) button.
- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Channel and press the ◄ or ▶ button.
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Manual Store and press the ◀ or ► button.

Result: The Manual Store menu is displayed with the Color System selected.

- 4 Press the ◄ or ► button repeatedly until the color is of the best quality.
 - Result: The **color System** is changed (depending on the model).

AUTO - PAL - SECAM - NTSC4.43 - NTSC3.58 (option)

NTSC4.43 is a "trick" playback mode used by special VCR's to play PAL-recorded videos in NTSC mode.

- 5 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the sound system and press the ◀ or ► button repeatedly until the sound is of the best quality.



If channel name information is broadcast when you store the channels either manually or automatically, the names are assigned to the channels directly. You can however change these names or assign new names as required.

You can exclude the channels of your choice from the channel scan operation. When you scan through the stored channels, those you have chosen to skip are not displayed.

All channels that you do not specifically choose to skip are displayed during scanning.

- 1 Press the MENU (IIII) button.
- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the channel and press the ◄ or ▶ button.
- 3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Add/Erase and press the ◄ or ► button.
 - <u>Result:</u> The Add/Erase menu is displayed.

Fine tuning Channel Reception

If the reception is clear, you do not have to fine-tune the channel, as this is done automatically during the search and store operation. If however the signal is weak or distorted, you may have to finetune the channel manually.

Selecting a Channel Numbered Ten or Over

Enter the two-digit channel number.
 <u>Example</u>: To select channel 42, press 4, followed by 2.


Most television channels carry "teletext," pages of written information that provide information such as:

- Television programme times
- News bulletins
- Weather forecasts
- Sports results
- Subtitles for the hard of hearing

The teletext pages are organized according to six categories:

Part	Contents

Displaying Teletext Information







Automatic Degaussing to Remove Color Patches

A degaussing coil is mounted around the picture tube, so you do not normally need to degauss the television manually.

If you move the television to a different position and color patches appear on the screen, you must:

- Switch the television off by pressing the " ① " (ON/OFF) button on the front panel
- Unplug the television from the wall socket
- ◆ Leave the television power-off (stand-by) for about 30 minutes so that the automatic degauss function can be activated, and then press the POWER (○) button on the remote control.
- If your television will be left unattended, press the " ① " (ON/OFF) button to turn your television off.

Troubleshooting: Before Contacting Service Personnel

Before contacting Samsung after-sales service, perform the following simple checks.

If you cannot solve the problem using the instructions below, note the model and serial number of the television and contact your local dealer.
